



GLENGUIN ESTATE

2006 IRONBARK TANNAT

Vineyard ; We have 2.5 acres of Tannat vines planted in rocky soils, below the ancient ironbark trees, on the top of the slope at Glenguin. The vines are extremely low yielding at a single tonne to the acre resulting in grapes with great depth of colour flavour and tannins.

Vinification ; Fermented and then macerated on skins in open steel fermenters the Tannat is then pressed and the wine ages in large puncheons for 12 months prior to bottling.

The Wine ; This ancient noble variety from SW France has found the ideal Australian home at Glenguin. Tannat's small thick skinned berries add terrific purple colour, spicy damson fruit characters and multiple layers of soft dusty tannins to this interesting wine. A rich racy concentrated red Glenguin Tannat will continue to develop in bottle over many years.
